Senior Graduation Policy Reminder

Students must have attended school at least 93% of the school days/class periods in both first and second semester of their Senior year in order to participate in the graduation ceremony. The Principal may waive this requirement for good and sufficient reason, such as an extended illness, family emergency, etc.

Students must have paid all fines, fees, and other financial obligations owed to the school district in order to participate in the graduation ceremony.

The district may provide accommodations for students with disabilities (IEP's or 504's), in accordance with sate and federal law and established procedures.





ACT Information for Juniors

Reminder from Feb. 20th testing: Your ACT scores got sent out 2/22. Just a reminder that you will get your scores mailed to your house in 6-8 weeks.

Any junior who would like to re-take their ACT can do so by registering for the A.C.T. online at www.actstudent.org. The testing fee is \$50.50 or \$67.00 for the A.C.T. Plus Writing. Testing is on Saturday mornings beginning at 8:00 a.m. and ending around 12:00 p.m.. Make sure to register before the deadline in order to avoid a late fee.
