# Rib Lake High School

### Student School Attendance

One of the areas of concern that arises each year is student school attendance. The state attendance regulations that the school district is mandated to comply with are outlined in student handbooks and are discussed with students on the first day of school. We ask that parents or guardians contact the school when their student will be/has been absent. Parents are also encouraged to obtain verification for any appointments to professionals for their child. Just a reminder that state attendance procedures allow parents to post-excuse a maximum of 10 days. Please take the time to review this issue with your student since we are obligated by the state to enforce it.

The following graduation policy attendance rules apply to high school seniors:

- Students must have attended school at least 93% of the school days/periods in both first and second semester of their Senior year to participate in Graduation. This includes all pre-planned and parent excused absences. The Principal may waive this requirement for good and sufficient reason (extended illness, family emergency, extended vacation, etc.)
- Students must have paid all fines, fees and other financial obligations owed to the school district and make up any disciplinary time owed in order to participate in the Graduation ceremony.
- Student participation in the Graduation ceremony is a privilege. Any multiple-day school suspension or school related legal referral during senior year may result in revocation of the graduation ceremony privilege.

### Thank You to Custodial Staff

A big thank you to the custodial staff, who worked hard this summer to help upgrade and make the building look new. Some highlighted changes to the middle and high school buildings are:

- creation of a middle level technology lab to promote collaboration and deeper understanding. The room will house virtual learning equipment purchased by the CLC.

- completion of new carpeting and painting to upgrade select middle school classrooms.

the addition of an innovation lab at the high school. The school district received a technology grant to help equip and furnish the area which has flexible work spaces to promote student collaboration.
grant funding and donated equipment will allow RLHS to offer teachers from other schools and colleges to interact daily with our students in coursework previously not available.

- a much needed updating to the high school north bathrooms is almost complete. New sinks, trim, and painting have all been part of the work to update bathrooms original to the construction of the high school.

- the gym has been upgraded with new paint, floor finish, and bleachers. The new bleachers address the issues of the previous 1964 bleachers relating to access and safety. A big thank you to the Rib Lake Athletic Booster Club for their work in fundraising to help make the bleacher replacement a reality. The group raised approximately \$5000 from Drive 4UR School. They are currently writing grants and working on a Friends of Rib Lake Schools Donation Wall project. Students will be given their Chromebooks starting the first day of school if the parent/student acknowledgement form is returned by noon on Friday, September 1st. No Chromebooks can be issued without the forms being returned. Summer training/early checkout was not offered this year due to all students having been through extensive training last year.

### Student Supply List

The high school requires students to have pens, pencils, note paper, student organizer or notebooks, and highlighters. Other needed materials are schedule specific and will be discussed on the first day of school.

Middle school supply lists are available by contacting the middle school office or by checking the school website. They are also available at WalMart in Medford.

### 6-12 Lunch Prices
