ACT TESTING

ACT testing for juniors is scheduled for February 27th, with the WorkKeys assessment being the following day. All juniors are required to take the ACT regardless of college plans. The staff has been doing ACT review activities since the start of the new year to prepare students for the test and we will be sponsoring daily activities during February during enrichment study hall to give students more practice on the ACT exam. Due to ACT's stringent requirements, we will be testing in the middle school again this year. That will result in the middle school having classes at the high school on the 27th.

Open Enrollment and Tuition Waiver Information

The application period for the 2018-19 school year is February 5—April 30, 2018. Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend a school district other than the one in which they live. Parents must complete an online application no earlier than February 5, 2018, and no later than April 30, 2018 by 4:00 p.m. The DPI website to complete an application is: http://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment. At this time, once a student is accepted to attend the Rib Lake School District under open enrollment, the student may continue to attend the district without having to reapply every year.
