# ACT Prep

ACT testing for Juniors is Tuesday, February 27th. Juniors at RLHS took the ACT Pretest in November to give students the true experience of what the ACT is like. Individual meetings were held with each student to review the scores and to discuss how the scores fit into the student's overall postsecondary goals. Over the next two months, students will be given the opportunity to take part in activities which allow them to practice ACT questions, focus their writing and to learn how to be better test takers. Announcements and mailings will keep students and parents informed of how to take advantage of these opportunities.

WITC is offering a four night ACT prep event that is taking place through our ITV room. The test prep will run from Monday, February 19th to Thursday, February 22nd from 6:00-8:00 p.m. Throughout the week, there will be information on each of the four subject areas, English, Reading, Math, and Science. The cost for the whole week is \$30.94. The school will reimburse any student that attends 3 out of 4 days.
