Picture retakes will be taken in the morning on Thursday, November 14th.

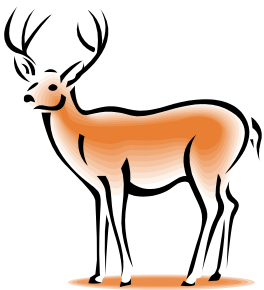
THANKSGIVING VACATION

PRE-PLANNED HUNTING

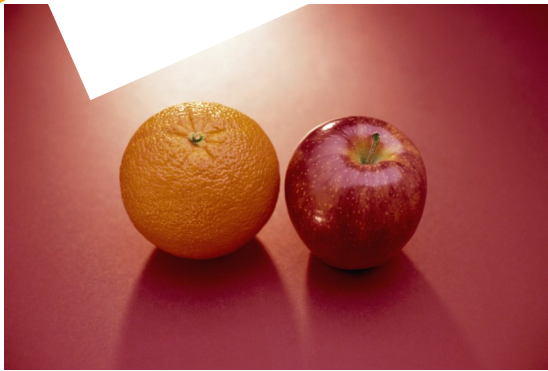

TECHNICAL EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

Technical Excellence Scholarships (TES) are to be awarded by the State of Wisconsin to Wisconsin high school seniors who have the highest demonstrated level of proficiency in technical education subjects. The scholarships are only for use at a school within the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) located within the state. The value of the scholarship is up to \$2,250 per year, to be applied towards tuition.

Students wishing to be considered for the TES need to meet eligibility criteria set by the Wisconsin Higher Educational Aids Board (HEAB) and will need to be nominated by their school. Schools will need to select a student or students to nominate in February 2018. More information can be found on HEAB's web site, at www.heab.wisconsin.gov.

Congratulations to 2017 National Honor Society Inductees

Students eligible for Rib Lake High School National Honor Society must meet the following criteria:

- Earn a 3.5 GPA at the beginning of their Junior and/or Senior year.
- Demonstrate positive character, leadership, and community service.

Students who meet the GPA criteria are scored (10 to 1) by the high school faculty based on their character, leadership and service. Students must obtain a minimal average score of 6 to have their application considered by the faculty senate. The faculty senate then determines which students will be admitted into the National Honor Society.

JUNIOR PRE-ACT EXAM

To help students score better on the February exam, we will be having all Juniors take a pre-ACT at school on the morning of November 7th. November 7th is a half day for students and the preliminary testing will take most of the morning. Our overall goal for the pre-testing is to give students a predictive score for them to see, experience the test format and time limits, and to give them areas to improve on for the February test date. Our data shows that students who retake the ACT exam in May show dramatic improvement in their scores by becoming better test takers and by understanding exam time constraints better.

The time limit for each subject area is listed below:

English: 45 minutes

Math: 60 minutes

Break: 10 minutes

Reading: 35 minutes

Science: 35 minutes

After testing is complete, we will be scoring the exams so students will be able to see a predicted score for each subject area as well as an overall score. These scores will be shared with the students during class time and options for improving their ACT scores before the February assessment will be discussed.

SOPHOMORES TO VISIT NTC AND UWMC

On Wednesday, November 8th, the sophomores will be traveling to Wausau to visit Northcentral Technical College and University of Wisconsin-Marathon County. During their time at NTC, students will be able to view the campus, as well as learn about the different programs the campus has to offer. They will also visit a career fair where they will meet with different employers and find what education and training are involved to be employed with those companies. During the students' time at UWMC, they will meet with an admission advisor that will go over some details about the campus, such as admission requirements, programs, and courses. After the presentation, the students will have the opportunity to tour campus and visit the residential hall.
