



## Counselor's Corner







Hello Families! During the month of December, students focused on the character trait empathy. Students learned empathy means putting yourself in someone else's shoes and trying to understand how they feel. It's important for children to be able to see things from someone else's point of view, even if they don't agree with them or feel the same way they do.

When students learn about empathy, they are more equipped to recognize when someone is angry, sad, happy, or scared. Once they learn how to recognize others emotions and feelings, they are better able to respond with understanding and kindness. Doing this will help them to build relationships and connect with others.

You can help your students learn empathy by giving them opportunities to practice and by modeling how to be empathetic. Starting this during their elementary years will have a huge impact on who your students will be as they continue their academic journey.
