# Fall Benchmark Assessment Results

With the end of Quarter 1 fast approaching, please watch for your child's report card coming home at the beginning of November.

Some students might feel a little "quizzy" in their stomachs There is no need to feel nervous as this assessment is a great way to show what one knows. With this report card, you will find a printout of your child's Fall MAP assessment results in both reading and math for students in Kindergarten through 5th grade. These scores help teachers determine what support your child may need during WIN (What I Need) time or if they may need additional intensive interventions outside of the classroom. You will find a graph showing your child's progress (if they have taken this test previously) as well as information that lets you know how your child is doing compared to same-aged peers around the nation.

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## Counselor's Corner

Hello families! Throughout the month of October students focused on the character trait of friendship. Many REACH classes placed a focus on building friendships and handling conflicts with their peers. Most kids face pressure when they get to middle or high school, but did you know that even in elementary school, children can feel pressure to fit in and to do what "everyone else" is doing? Sometimes, that means going along with teasing on the playground. Other times, it means watching a movie at a friend's house that she would never be allowed to watch at home. Now is the time to teach your child how to handle peer pressure—and how to say no to things that don't fit with your family's rules or values. Encourage your child to say and remember these statements:

- · I can say no to things that would put me in danger.
- · I can make good choices for myself.
- · I can say, "You're my friend, but I don't choose to do that."
- It's OK if I make choices that are not the same as the choices my friends make
