Greetings Rib Lake School District Families!

I find it hard to believe we are half way through summer and in just over a month we will be back at it – even sooner for our football, volleyball, and cross-country teams, many of which will have a game or two completed before school even starts.

This year school starts on the Friday before Labor Day weekend. I know this is not the 'best' way to get started but when the Calendar Development team got together, there were several things to consider and there was a strong desire to get school done without going into the second week of June, thus, we start on Friday and end on Friday. Teachers will have been working hard prior to the first day of work, many of which spent quality summer days preparing and growing as educators to bring additional learning into the classroom. It is shaping up to be a great year!

We will continue to build on creating a positive culture based on how our students, staff, and community members *experience* our schools. With our blueprint, The Rib Lake Way, we reinforce the beliefs, behaviors, and outcomes we strive to achieve. The 2016-17 school year was a successful introduction to this blueprint. We move

forward looking to reinforce these values, which will lead to success in a variety of areas, including building a "Culture of Champions". This type of culture includes building positive leaders at all ages, who can use the skills throughout many areas of their lives. It is an exciting time in the Rib Lake School District, developing a culture that engages, aligns, and energizes students and staff, making it a great place to learn and a great place to work!

In June we learned that we would be receiving more than \$22,000 through a Wisconsin Technology Initiative grant. These dollars are being used to create an innovative, collaborative classroom in both the middle and high school. Additionally, Chromebooks have been ordered to help support our 1:1 program in the elementary. Technologically supported instruction and ongoing professional development for teachers will continue to transform the way we teach and learn resulting in more engaged, higher-achieving students at Rib Lake.

I think you will like our new bleachers in the high school gymnasium and the new innovative classrooms in both the middle and high schools. Our custodians and maintenance crew have been preparing the schools for students in the fall. As you can tell, there has been a lot going on and we are excited to get started on September 1st.

2015 REFERENDUM UPDATE

At the Board of Education meeting earlier this month, Ann Arney, ICS Consulting Services, did a review of the 2015 Facility Upgrade Referendum. Ann, who has continued to work with us at no additional charge, discussed the savings gained through the referendum upgrades. She showed that there have been significant savings in electric, gas, wood, and water, all resulting in -8% and over \$23,000 cost avoidance. We celebrated the fact that ALL THREE SCHOOLS qualify for ENERGY STAR Certification with outstanding scores of 75 or higher! Way to go!!

GET CONNECTED!

DIRECTORY INFORMATION

There are many times when the school would like to recognize students publicly for their accomplishments. This may be displayed in the school, on the school website, in school newsletters, and/or shared with the media. In releasing directory data, your passive permission is required. Directory information includes student name, address, birth date, participation in special activities, and photographs. Any parent NOT wanting this information, or parts of it, released must make such a request in writing to the principal within 14 days of the first day of school. Parents have: 1) their right to inspect, review and obtain copies of student records; 2) their right to request the amendment of the student's school records if they believe the records are inaccurate, misleading, or otherwise in violation of the student's rights of privacy; 3) their right to consent to the disclosure of the student's school records, except to the extent state and federal law authorizes disclosure without consent; and 4) their right to file a complaint with the Family Policy Compliance Office of the U.S. Department of Education.

FOOD SERVICE UPDATES

The school district will continue to use the automated breakfast/lunch procedures for 2017-18. Due to a mandatory cost increase, full priced meals have increased.

- ❖ *Extra Milk/Juice* = \$.30
- ❖ *Elementary Breakfast* \$1.25 & *Lunch* \$2.70
- ❖ *Middle/High School Breakfast* \$1.60 & *Lunch* \$2.95

Students eligible for free or reduced lunches during the 2016-17 school year may continue that status for 30 operating days, pending receipt and approval of updated forms from parents for the 2017-18 school year. Forms will be mailed to each family in a separate mailing.

Each family has been issued a "password" to allow access to account balances. Families new to the district

will be mailed information regarding their account. If you need assistance with this process, please contact your respective school office.

The policy on School Meal Accounts (BP #763) has been updated and parents/students should review it in full on our website. A partial reading follows:

Parents and guardians must plan for their child to have sufficient access to food at school on each school day and must actively monitor and manage their child's school food service account. In order to help parents and guardians meet these responsibilities, the District has established the following guidelines regarding food-service charges and student access to food at school:

1. A student will always be permitted to select and receive one of the standard school meal options if either of the following apply: a) the district has determined that the student is currently eligible to receive free meals at school; or b) the student has sufficient prepaid funds in his/her food service account.

2. When a student purchases a school meal or any other food-service items, the general rule is that payment is due no later than at the time of service. However, the District's food service account system normally allows a family to charge up to \$35.00 in his/her account as a negative balance before the District will take steps to restrict the student's food choices. The primary purpose of allowing a limited and temporary negative balance is to prevent an unexpected interruption in meal service on a day that a student inadvertently has insufficient funds available. In addition: a) the District may deny the privilege of charging items to a student who repeatedly establishes a negative account balance that is not promptly repaid upon notice of the amount owed, b) a parent or guardian may arrange to restrict their child's ability to charge a negative balance or set a daily limit on food charges made to the student individual or family account, c) at each meal service, a student may charge only one of the standard school meal options that

is being offered (i.e., a federally-qualifying meal option that is on the menu.

3. Students who are not eligible for free school meals, who do not have money to pay for their food, who have reached their limit on unrestricted charges, and who do not bring food from home will be permitted to receive at no cost a low-cost meal that is specified by the District and that is being offered at the particular meal service.

FOUR-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN ORIENTATION

Parents of children entering Four-Year-Old Kindergarten are invited to an orientation on **Tuesday, August 22nd, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. in the K-2 center at Rib Lake Elementary School.** This is an opportunity for parents and children to become familiar with their teacher, classroom, daily routine, and preschool curriculum. A child's early school experiences are critical to their success, and in working collaboratively with parents, we want to ensure a positive start for every child. We look forward to meeting you on August 22nd!

HEALTH INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Please remember to fill out your student's medical information and emergency contacts at the beginning of the year so we can notify you, in a timely manner, of health issues when your child(ren) are at school. This information is also reviewed by our school nurse, who may meet with your student.



Students may need to receive medication during school hours related to either acute or chronic conditions in order for them to benefit from

educational services. Administration of medication by school staff must follow the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction established policy/procedures:

1. Prescription medications given at school must have a signed physician's note and signed parent/guardian note in place before they can be given. Non-prescription medications given at school must have a signed parent/guardian note in place before they can be given. If the non-prescription medication dose to be given is different than on the bottle, a physician's signed note is also required.

2. A new permission form for each medication must be submitted each school year.

3. Prescription medication (including asthma medication) must be in original bottle/container with current label including student's name, name of medication, dose, and name of physician.

4. Non-prescription medications should also be in the original container.

Medications given at school are documented by the staff administering them and regularly reviewed by the school nurse.

If you have any questions or health concerns regarding your student or health issues at school, please feel free to call your student's school.

NEW STUDENTS / NEW FAMILY ADDITIONS

If your family, or a family you know, has recently moved to the area and there are student(s) who would like to enroll in the Rib Lake School District, please contact the appropriate school office to ensure a smooth start for each student.

If you have a recent addition to your family, please contact Neva at 715.427.5446. The school district records all children (along with pertinent information) that live within the district. This information ensures families are contacted when age appropriate school offerings are available for their children.

SCHOOL START UP FORMS

Parents are asked to thoroughly review all information sent home with students on the first day of school. These items will include emergency forms, internet consent forms, etc. (to be completed and returned). Please take the time to review this information with your student. Handbooks are located on the website of each school.

STUDENT SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

One of the areas of concern that arises each year is student school attendance. The state and local attendance regulations that the school district is mandated to comply with are outlined in your student's handbook, and are discussed with students on the first day of school. **Parents or guardians MUST contact the school when their student will be/has been absent.** If this is not done, the student will be marked 'UNEXCUSED' which eventually leads to truancy reporting. Parents are also encouraged to obtain verification for any appointments to professionals for their child. Please take the time to review this issue with your student since we are obligated by the state to enforce it. Students in grades K-12 may be excused from school by their parent for no more than 10 days each year and must have a medical/legal excuse for any days beyond this point. The school feels family outings are very valuable educational opportunities. Anyone planning a family trip must complete a family trip form and return it to their child's building principal prior to the anticipated event. This will pre-excuse your child and request make-up assignments. Unless other arrangements have been made with individual teachers, it is required that homework be

completed before trip departure or at the latest, upon return to school.

STUDENT SUPPLY LISTS

Recommended supply lists for students entering PreK-8th grade for the 2017-18 school year are available at Medford's Wal-Mart & Kmart, by contacting the elementary or middle school office, or by checking the school website. The high school requires students to have pens, pencils, note paper, student organizer or notebooks, and highlighters. Other needed materials are schedule specific and will be discussed on the first day.



STUDENT WALKERS

For safety reasons, elementary students that walk to school should use the marked crosswalk by the middle school. This crosswalk connects with the walking trail that leads to the elementary school. **NO STUDENT SHOULD WALK TO SCHOOL ALONG CTH D.**

TEXTBOOKS/CHROMEBOOKS

Textbooks & Chromebooks are available to students at no charge. However, if it is determined that a student damages/loses any district owned textbook or Chromebook during the time it is entrusted to the student, the student/student's family is responsible for the cost of damages incurred or the replacement cost of the item.

ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Students should report to their assigned classrooms on the first day of school. Staff will be available for students needing assistance.

Classes will begin every day at 8:05 a.m. and dismissal times are as follows: 4 year old KG—3:00 p.m., grades K-2—3:05 p.m., and grades 3-5—3:10 p.m. Breakfast and lunch meals will be available to students beginning Friday, September 1st. Breakfast is served from 7:45-8:15 a.m. daily.

MIDDLE SCHOOL / HIGH SCHOOL

What's New for 2017-18

The middle school has created a technology innovation lab which will allow students to use technology tools to create a deeper understanding of the subjects they are studying. The lab will house a Z Space Computer which uses interactive virtual reality to enhance and offer science, technology, and engineering experiences not available in a regular classroom experience. The lab

will also house a set of virtual reality viewers, designed to enhance learning in all subject areas. The lab will be open to all classrooms in the district.

The high school will have a new distance learning lab that allows for students to take expanded curriculum offerings from teachers in other districts and post-secondary schools. The lab will allow students to take classes via interactive television which allows students to have direct contact with a teacher for 45 minutes daily. The lab will allow RLHS to offer students more choices for classes that meet their career goals, while offering another learning format in addition to the current traditional and online courses.

The high school will also have a collaboration lab to promote project based learning in a group setting. The lab will have smart boards, group work areas, and a segregated instructional area. The furniture and room were designed to reflect the overarching goals of innovation and collaboration.

Class Dues: Class dues will be \$15.00 per year for freshman, sophomores, juniors, and seniors. Class dues should be paid in the High School office. Class dues are used to cover class activities, prom, and graduation expenses.

Middle School Music: All 6th grade students must take part in band or choir (they may take both) to fulfill a music requirement. Students in grades 7-8

have fulfilled this requirement and are encouraged to have music be a part of their schedule. Any changes to a students' music schedule must be completed by the end of the first week in September. Changes require a note from the parent stating the change and the reason for the change. The teacher and principal will also need to sign the change request before the office can officially change the schedule.

High School Class Schedules and Schedule Change Timeline: Students should receive their schedules in the mail after July 31st. Schedule change dates will be on Wednesday, August 16th from 8:00 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. and Thursday, August 17th from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

1 to 1 Chromebook Initiative: The School District of Rib Lake is committed to creating an environment that is responsive to individual student needs through effective collaboration and instructional practices using technology integration. This enables and supports students and teachers to implement transformative uses of technology while enhancing students' engagement with content and promoting the development of self-directed, lifelong, global learners. In order to meet this commitment, all students in grades 6-12 will be receiving a school issued Chromebook to make technology learning tools accessible to all students throughout the day.

All students in grades 6-12 will receive training in the proper usage, learning tools, and care of Chromebooks before being assigned a Chromebook. At the high school level, students will be allowed to take the devices home to extend learning opportunities. All training and Chromebook checkout will be done on Friday, September 1st or Tuesday, September 5th. There will not be summer Chromebook training this year. Middle School students will not be able to take their Chromebook home and will receive their training as part of reading/language arts classes the first week of school.

The School District of Rib Lake completed a comprehensive inspection of district buildings to determine the presence of asbestos containing material and initiatives to eliminate and control the presence of asbestos have been implemented. Some amounts of asbestos conating material remain in district buildings. MacNeil Enviromental testing conducts a surveillance of all sites and the district receives updated reports.

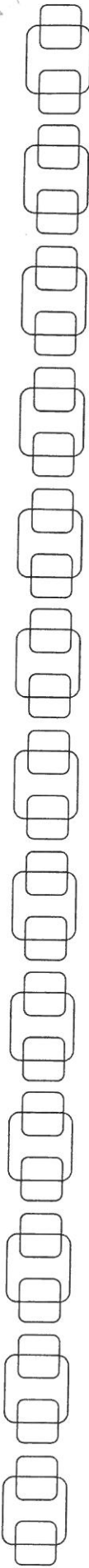
ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Rib Lake is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Jonathon Dallmann, Director of Special Education, at 715.427.3222, or by writing him at P.O. Box 278, Rib Lake, WI 54470.
