PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

Dear RLMS Families,

Welcome back to the start of a fresh, new school year! There is excitement in the air as our building project is well underway, and we are excited to continue seeing progress throughout the school year. At the middle school this year, students have noticed that the Science room has received a much needed update. They have also noticed new bathrooms and new locker rooms.

Students did a great job demonstrating flexibility last year as we practiced transitioning quickly between the two buildings using the sidewalks in front of the buildings instead of through the parking lot. We will continue with that path this year as students will be transitioning to the High school for all specials (Shop, Art, Business, FCS, Spanish) and music classes (Band and Choir). Breakfast for all middle and high school students will be served in the High School Commons (students eating breakfast should get dropped off at the high school to ensure they have time to eat!). All middle school students will be eating lunch together in the high school from 11:00-11:30, while all high school students will be eating together at a later time.

CODE OF CONDUCT

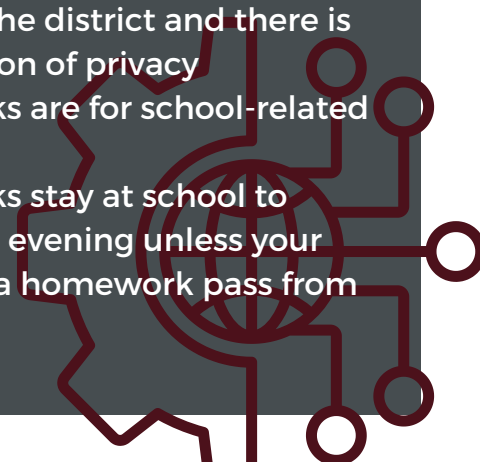
Students should

WHAT DO YOU DO FOR FUN?

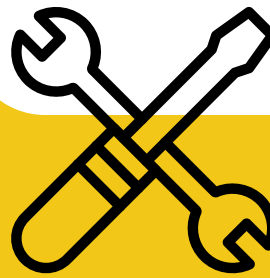
I enjoy being in nature, traveling, bicycling, motorcycling, eco-printing, making journals and bookmarks, art journaling, and spending time with my pets.

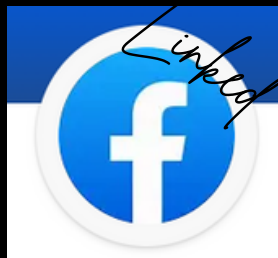
